- 6. To fix the high definition cameras in the premises to keep the vigilance and protect the infrastructure from theft, fire and natural and man made calamities.

- c. To arrange the medical checkup camps.
- d. To provide maximum sports facilities to the players.
- e. To purchase generator to support the whole premises during power failure.
