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REVIEW

In order to create quality in Higher education the UGC has started the process of accreditation. In response to this our College has started this process in 2002-2003 which was completed after the Peer Team's visit to our College on 4th Feb. 2004 as a result the College was accredited with B+Grade. With a view to maintain the accredited grade and progress of our College the Management and the Administration had informal meetings to discuss the vision, the Master plan and it's execution in the years to come. The Academic staff of our college is trying to improve upon their academic performance through Number of ways. Therefore, we are optimistic to get B++ or A Grade in the next process of our reaccredidation.

As per the guidelines of NAAC, IQUAC was formed in 2004-2005 to discuss the post accredited achievements, short-falls and the future plans. The Principal, the Coordinator, the IQUAC Team, the staff and the students had a great experience of understating the post NAAC achievements and Planning for subsequent years. With this we present our achievements during 2005-2006 and the plans for the future in the following '38-Point Present Status and Expectation plan.'

Part A:

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the out come achieved by the end of the year. The meeting of the IQAC was held in June 2005 to decide the plan of action for the next academic year. In the beginning review of activities during the last year was done. All members expressed satisfaction with the activities for quality enhancement undertaken during the last year. While outlining the action plan for the next academic year the following points were mainly taken into consideration.

- a) Feedback received from the outgoing students
- b) Points raised in the meetings with the parents
- c) Suggestions of university authorities who visited college time to time.
- d) Views of faculty.
- e) The resources of management.
- f) Expectations of academic peers who visited the college.

Keeping in mind the above factors the IQAC unanimously decided to implement the following plan of action for achieving greater academic progress during 2005-06.

1) Curricular activities:

- (i) To start undergraduate course in microbiology
- (ii) To provide more attention in strengthening B.Sc. computer and IT courses.
- (iii) To seek opinions from stake holders on curriculum introduced at degree level.

2) Teaching, Learning and Evaluation:

(i) It was decided to start the practices of framing the academic calendar, preparation of teaching plan well in advance, maintaining the academic diaries by the members of faculty monitoring the process of teaching, four class tests and two term end exams.

- (ii) To make the budgetary provision for purchase of teaching aids.
- (iii) To conduct internal examinations and to display results in advance.
- (iv) To take efforts for improving attendance of students to the classes and practical.
- (v) The parent institution be requested to organize one day orientation course for faculty improvement at the beginning of the academic year.

3) Research Consultancy and Extension activities:

- (i) It was decided to encourage more teachers to do research leading to Ph.D. and avail the teacher fellowships.
- (ii) Teachers are directed to write papers and participate in national and International conferences.
- (iii) Teachers are advised to write minor research projects. It was decided to submit five proposals from each faculty.
- (iv) The department of psychology is advised to do student counseling at the time of admission in order to make a proper selection of branch taking in to consideration the student interest and aptitude.
- (v) NCC unit to be encouraged to undertake relief work as and when required.
- (vi) The department of Botany be advised to undertake drives for greater awareness of pollution control.
- (vii) IQAC resolved to organize state level conference on 'Quality in higher education', with the financial assistance from NAAC.

4) Infrastructure and Learning Resources:

- (i) Considering the increasing strength in computer and IT branches it is decided to request the management to purchase 30 computers.
- (ii) Make plan to establish new men hostel.
- (iii) Addition of new books and journals in the library.

- (iv) Taking in to consideration the scarcity of water it is decided to bore a well by spending about Rs. 1 lac.
- (v) To provide required furniture and equipments to the laboratories.

5) Student support and Progression:

- (i) To form a committee for advising Principal in all matters of granting scholarships.
- (ii) To grant full free ships to physically disable students.
- (iii) To provide greater incentives to sports persons participating in national level tournaments.
- (iv) To give away prizes to the toppers in University exams.
- (v) To provide prompt assistance to students requiring bus and train concessions.
- (vi) To adjust reading room timings as per the requirements of the students.
- (vii) The placement cell be advised to work in collaborations with DIC and Urban cooperative Banks and organize one day camps for employment guidance.
- (viii) The women empowerment cell be advised to undertake medical checkup of women students.

6) Organization and Management:

- (i) It was suggested by IQAC to take a review of various committees formed for performing various activities. Certain changes were necessitated due to retirement and transfers of the members of the faculty working on the committee.
- (ii) All committees required to be requested to adhere to the academic calendar prepared by the college. Curricular and extra curricular activities should mostly be conducted as indicated in the academic calendar of the college.

- (iii) It was advised in the meeting to continue ahead the well set practice of maintaining academic diaries by faculty and worked diaries by non teaching staff.
- (iv) The management suggested that, the three members of the management would be observing and monitoring the academic progress of certain departments in consultation with Principal.
- (v) Daily teaching to be observed and its record be maintained by vice principals.
- (vi) Few more members of non-teaching staff be advised to undergo computer training. So that automation to a larger extent could be achieved in the office and library administration.

7) Best Practices:

- (i) The management be suggested to increase the amount of the fund earmarked for providing assistance to physically disable, orphans and such other students facing grave calamities.
- (ii) In order to foster the failing brother hood among students the teachers be asked to monitor welcome and send off functions, solely organized by the students.
- (iii) In order to inculcate civics sense among students the number of blood donation camps and camps for relief work be raised.
- (iv) The practice of honoring retiring employees be continued.
- (v) The practice of get together shared by all constituents of the college be continued.
